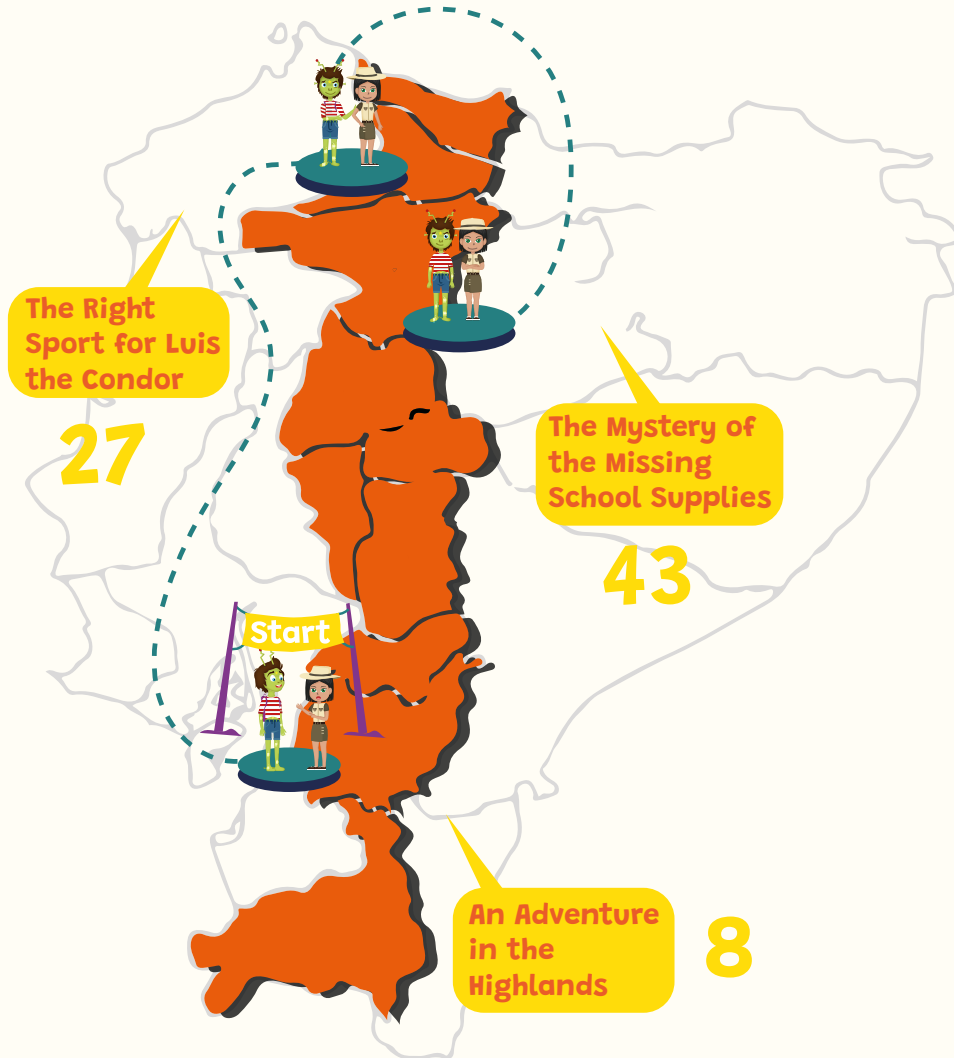

Prologue

In this book, you will find three stories about Orion and Isabela's adventures in the Highlands of Ecuador. These stories are based on specific grammar and vocabulary topics to be used inside or outside the classroom. Teachers can do storytelling and group work activities in class time to practice, or they can ask parents to tell the stories to their children, outside the classroom, as an autonomous activity. This book offers pre-reading, while-reading, and post-reading activities on each story, so educators can practice reading as a skill and, at the same time, interact with students and have fun with the interesting activities provided by the publication.

This book goes along with the curricular threads of communication and cultural awareness, oral communication, reading, and language through the arts, topics proposed by Ecuador's Ministerio de Educación. All the stories can be used for the fourth grade of elementary school to complement the fifth module of Ministerio de Educación del Ecuador's curriculum.

“An Adventure in the Highlands” is a story with which students can identify geography, vocabulary, and concepts to know different Ecuadorian places. “The Right Sport for Luis the Condor” can be used to learn vocabulary about sports and their equipment and also, to practice the days of the week. “The Mystery of the Missing School Supplies” can be used to practice vocabulary related to school supplies.

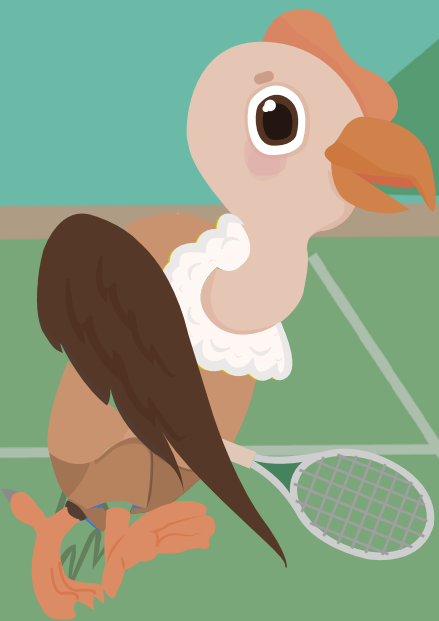
While reading activities

Orion and Isabela talked to the teacher, Ms. Killari, about what had happened. Then, the three of them thought about a solution.



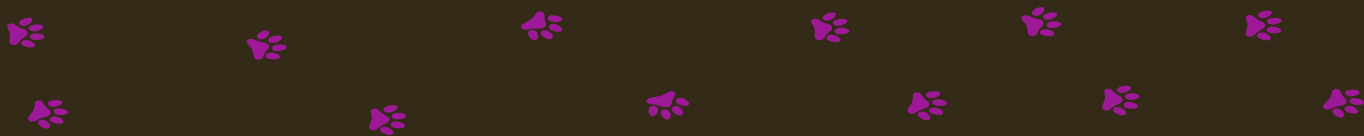
I have an idea!
